Additionally, data reported in an LCAP is to be consistent with data reported in the SARC.

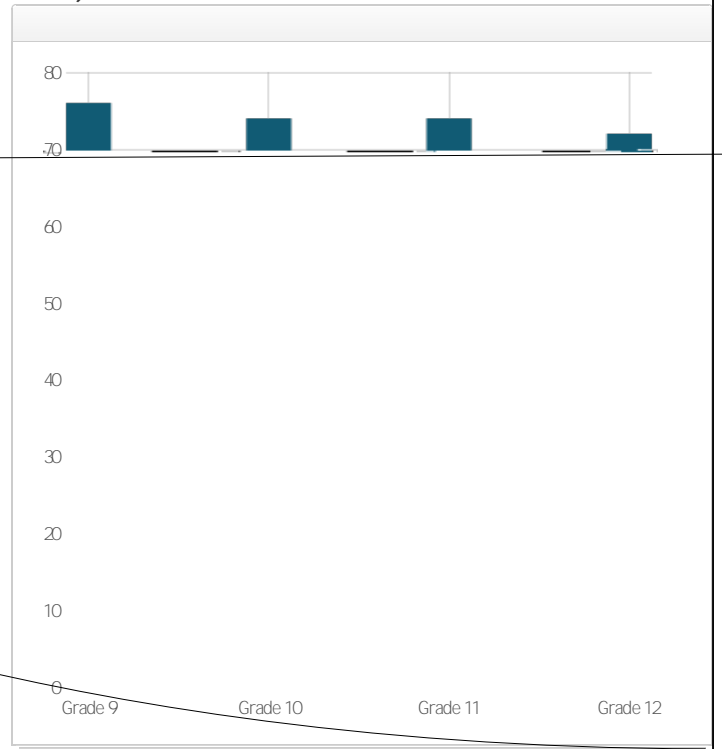
