The Richmond High Security Cameras project is completed. Walsh Electronic Systems Technology is the contractor. This project includes installation of a full system **ovesila** cameras with all supporting infrastructure and head end equipment. The Boar**phesis** ously approved a changetime work to include high resolution cameras. This final change order closes out the project and includes the followint Electrical power feeds to multiple video recorder locations; additional pan tilt zoom cameras at the footbat field area; and a new conference room monitoring station. These increases to the project have resulted potential change orders in excess of Public **Cont**Code 10% limit. Staff is requesting Board approval of change orders, with the findings as noted below, on the project as follows:
