

WCCUSD IMMIGRATION GUIDANCE & COMMUNIQUE

WCCUSD stands with our students, families, and staff during these challenging times and is committed to doing everything possible to ensure schools are safe and inclusive for all students and families. Our schools have a response plan on what to do if there is Immigration Customs Enforcement (ICE) activity on or near a school.

We expect that it is very unlikely that ICE would come onto a school campus, however, we do want to be prepared. The information shared in this document includes our district-wide plan.

- **What support is available for documented, undocumented, and mixed-status immigrant families?**

- Families can take very important steps now to prepare for an emergency situation. The following precautions can help you and your family prepare for ICE activity.
- Update [Emergency Contact Information](#) : Make sure you have provided the most up-to-date information on the PowerSchool portal and your school's emergency card, including family members and trusted friends who could pick your child up from school.

- Save key phone numbers: your school's main office and afterschool providers
- Connect with Immigration legal providers like Stand Together Contra Costa which provides rapid response and immigration legal services in Contra Costa County by calling (925) 900-5151 or visiting [www.standtogether.org](#)

- **What can be done if immigration activity happens?**

- Take precautions to stay safe. If ICE activity does occur at a WCCUSD school, remember that the school is directed to follow protocols ([Safety](#), [Security](#)).
- If you are concerned about your ability to drop off or pick up your student at school, call the main office at school or afterschool provider to make arrangements.
- Report suspected ICE action to Stand Together Contra Costa: (925) 900-5151 The Stand Together Hotline is prepared to respond to any reports of ICE law enforcement in Contra Costa County as well as answer questions about legal rights and provide referral to legal support services.
