* F.1 Naming Building 10 at De Anza High School

Comment

Board Policy 7310 establishes the criteria and processes for fire buildings, parts of buildings or athletic fields in honor of the contributions of students, staff members and community members." With construction about to begin on Building 10 at De Anza High School, Mr. Charles Ramsey requested that Building 10 benamed in honor of his late father, Judge Henry Ramsey, Jr. A portion of Building 10 will be used to house the Law Academy at DAHS which is currently named the Henry Ramsey, Jr. Law Academy. * G.1 Resolution No. 321415: Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, 2014 Sies A, in an Aggregate Principal Amount not to Exceed \$135,000,000, Including Bond Subject to the Compounding of Interest, and Approving Certain Other Matters Relating to Said Bonds

Comment

The District's financing team, including KNN Public Finance, District's financial advisor, and Piper Jaffray & Co., Stifel Nicolaus and Backstrom McCarley Berry & Co. LLC (collectively, the "Underwriters"), and Nixon Peabody LLP, have prepared documentation for the purpose of permitting the District to issue its 2010 Series C Bonds and its 2012 Series B Bonds. The 2010 Series C Bonds will be issued pursuant to an authorization approved by 62.6% of the eligible voters of the District at an election on June 8, 2010, known as Measure D. The District has previously issued and sold \$140,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of bonds under Measure D, and the 2010 Series C Bonds will represent the fourth series of bonds issued under Measure D. The 2012 Series B Bonds will be issued pursuant to an authorization approved 64.4% of the eligible voters of the District at an election on November 6, 2012, known as Measure E. The District has previously issued and sold \$85,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of bonds under Measure E, and the 2012 Series B Bonds willerethe second series of bonds issued under Measure E. The proceeds of the Bonds will be used for projects authorized under the measure.

In order to accomplish the District's present construction and modernization program without significant delays, it is necessary to preserve the District's option to issue bonds with the provisions of than thirty years. Such a structure requires the Board, in turn, to comply with the provisions of Assembly Bill 182, comprising portions of Section 15146 of the Education Code ("A.B. 182"). A.B. 182 requires certain special disclosures, hich are reflected in Exhibit D to this Resolution, and it also requires that the Resolution and those disclosures be submitted to the Board first as an information item at a regularly scheduled Board meeting, and acted upon at the next consecutively explanatuled Board meeting of November 12, 2014.

The finance will present to the Board the financing plan, an explanation of the necessity for bonds with maturities longer than thirty years, the information covered by this Resolution in compliance with A.B. 182 and describe the function of each of the attached documents.
