District to issue its 2010 Series C Bonds and its 2012 Series B Bonds. The 2010 Series C Bonds will be issued pursuant to an authorization approved by 62.6% of the eligible voters of the District at an election on June 8, 2010, known as Measure D. The District has previously issued and sold \$140,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of bonds under Measure D. The 2010 Series C Bonds will represent the fourth series of bonds issued under Measure D. The 2012 Series B Bonds will be issued pursuant to an authorization approved by 64.4% of the eligible voters of the District at an election on November 6, 2012 known as Measure E. The District has previously issued and sold \$85,000,000 in aggregate principal amount of bonds under Measure E, and the 2012 Series B Bonds will represent the second series of boilissued under Measure E. The proceeds of the Bondswijsed for projects authorized under the measure.

In order to accomplish the District's present construction and modernization program without significant delays, it is necessary to preserve the District's option to issue bonds with maturities longer than thirty years. Such a structure requires the Board, in turn, to comply with the provisionse of Section 15146 of the Education Code ("A.B. 182"). A.B. 182 requires certain special disclosures, which are reflected in Exhibit D to this Resolution, and it also requires that the Resolution and those disclosures be mitted to the Board first as an information item at a regularly scheduled Board meeting, which occurred on October 15, 2014 and acted upon at the next consecutive regularly scheduled Board meeting.

On September 17, 2014, the Board adopted Resolution Nt4 128,-declaring the Board's intent to convey the Easement. Thereafter, on October 13, 2014, the District published and posted Public Notice this Public Hearing in accordance with Education Code § 17558.
