Enclosed is the Negotiated Salary Settlement Disclosure letter for the tentative agreement with United Teachers of Richmond (UTR) which was approved by the County Office of Education on September 13, 2017 and which went to the Board for approval at the September 20, 2017 meeting. Ratification for the UTR settlement was held on September 15, 2017 and passed by an overwhelming 80%.

Biography

Richard Rothstein is a research associate of the Economic Policy Institute and a fellow at the Thurgood Marshall Institute of the NAACP Legal Defense Fund and of the Haas Institute at the University of California (Berkeley). He is the author of *The Color of Law: A Forgotten History of How our Government Segregated America*. The book recovers a forgotten history of how federal, state, and local policy explicitly segregated metropolitan areas nationwide, creating racially homogenous neighborhoods in patterns that violate the Constitution and require remediation.

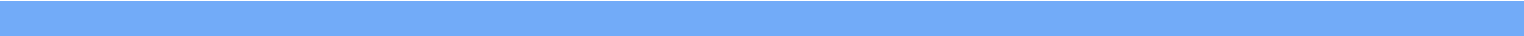
