Middle College High School (MCHS) was founded in 1989 as a unique partnership between Contra Costa College (CCC) and the West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD). It is located on the Contra Costa College campus where students have access to all of the college resources. MCHS works in conjunction with the Contra Costa College police services to ensure our students are safe on campus. We have always fostered a career and college readiness culture as our students have the opportunity to receive a high school diploma, certificate of completion in an occupation in a specific industry sector, an Associate Degree and/or completed their

Career Readiness

Education and Career Plan Developed

Middle College High School students follow a demanding education plan that gives them the opportunity to earn a high school diploma and meet university requirements while taking college courses and earning college units. Students develop the skills, knowledge, discipline and motivation to become lifelong, independent learners. Students participate in collaborative experiences that enable them to become productive, environmentally aware, economically independent citizens. Each student is given an educational plan when they enter Middle College and it does not change as they move up in grade level. Middle College currently has 73 9th graders, 66 10th graders, 64 11th graders, and 62 12th graders.

College Readiness

Community College Course Completed

As part of Middle College High School requirements, our students take college level courses and are required to pass all courses with a grade of C or higher. Students are given extra support to go along with any college level math, science, or social science classes in the form of early college seminar classes. The program is designed to provide a challenging, stimulating, caring, and supportive place with high expectations for students who are college bound. Each student is enrolled in 1-4 college classes each semester, totaling in 2-8 college classes taken a year per student. The graph shows how many community college courses were completed each year by the student body. In 2012, Middle College students completed a total of 201 college classes, in 2013 they completed 196, and in 2014 they completed 211.
